Repulse Bay -- This crescent-shaped strand of sand is one of the most beautiful beaches in Hong Kong. There are plenty of diversions nearby such as the ornate Life Guard Club, and the picturesque gardens that are dominated by towering twin statues of Kwun Yum and Tin Hau, both protectors of fishermen.

Stanley Market – It is the place to find silk garments, sportswear, art, Chinese costume jewellery, other souvenirs and a host of fantastic bargains.

Harbour Cruise -- Victoria Harbour is one of the world's busiest and most impressive natural harbours. You will enjoy the Hong Kong's striking coastline and the countless container vessels, junks, sampans and pleasure craft gliding around the harbour.

Jumbo Kingdom – Lunch will be taken in the famous giant floating restaurants, a three storeys high and elaborately decorated with swirling red and gold dragons and other traditional Chinese motifs.

Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre & Expo Promenade – The imposing Forever Blooming Bauhinia sculpture and the Reunification Monument located on the Expo Promenade outside the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre on the waterfront in Wan Chai marks the most significant occasion in Hong Kong's history.

Victoria Peak -- High above Hong Kong Island on the 'back of the Dragon', Victoria Peak is Hong Kong's premier visitor attraction, providing magnificent harbour and city views.

Madame Tussauds Hong Kong – It is the first Asia extension of the world-famous London wax portraits exhibition, which allows you to come face to face with incredibly realistic wax likenesses of 100 of the world's most famous people.

Avenue of Stars – This new tourism attraction pays tribute to the stars of the silver screen. The wide avenue has plaques, some with handprints of individual stars, sculptures and movie history milestones of the past years.
